Dear Friends,

Greetings to you in the name of Christ.

We are in the season of Lent. Lent invites us into a period of holy slowing down. In a world that rewards speed, productivity, and constant noise, the forty days before Easter gently ask us to pause, to notice, and to listen more carefully. Many people choose to fast from something during Lent—perhaps certain foods, habits, or sources of noise that pull attention away from what truly matters. Others take on a new practice: daily prayer, reading Scripture, acts of generosity, or serving those in need. Whether you give something up or take something on, the invitation is the same: let this season draw you closer to God and more deeply into compassion for others.

At its core, Lent is not about spiritual self-improvement or religious endurance. It is about making room. When Jesus goes into the wilderness (Matthew 4:1–11), He does not go there to prove His strength, but to be rooted more deeply in His identity as the beloved Son. Lent mirrors that journey for us. We step into the wilderness not to escape our lives, but to see them more clearly in the light of God's grace. It is about making space—space to listen more closely to God, to notice our neighbours, and to examine our own hearts with honesty and hope. When we speak of practices like fasting, giving something up, or taking on a new discipline, the goal is not self-denial for its own sake. Rather, it is to clear away distractions so that love can grow.

Lent also reminds us that faith is not only personal but communal. We walk this journey together, supporting one another through prayer, worship, and shared service. As a church, we are called to reflect Christ's love not just within our walls, but in the wider world—especially among those who are hurting, overlooked, or weary. As we move through this Lenten season, may we resist the urge to rush ahead to Easter morning. Instead, may we faithfully walk the road that leads there, trusting that God is at work in the quiet, the struggle, and the waiting.

In this period of stillness, the words of Psalm 51:10 rise like a gentle, persistent prayer: "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me." This is a cry of surrender—an opening of the heart to God's patient work. The psalmist does not ask for a touch-up or a quick fix. He asks for creation. "Create in me a clean heart" uses the same language as Genesis, the language of God bringing something new into being out of chaos. Perhaps, Lent is a period to acknowledge that we cannot scrub our hearts clean by willpower alone. What we need is a re-creation—a work only God can do. This prayer acknowledges both our brokenness and our trust that God is still a Creator, even in the mess of our lives.

Lenten season does not ask us to accomplish much. It asks us to be present. To pray honestly. To wait. May we travel through this season, not with fear, but with hope, knowing that the journey through repentance and reflection ultimately leads us to resurrection and new life.

ALPHA COURSE

Last year, over 2 million people around the world tried Alpha, with 10,000 courses run in the UK.

Alpha is designed to introduce people to Christianity and feel comfortable in a church. The course runs over a 12-week period usually about two hours a session. A meal is served with a chance to chat to each other, a video of around half an hour covers the topic of the week, which is followed by a discussion around the topic.

Boston Spa and Clifford Methodist Churches are currently running a course January to March on Thursday evenings between seven and nine pm. This initiative is intended to recruit new members to our churches. Recruitment of Alpha members is by personal invitation, this is the main way of successfully filling the course, supplemented by advertising. We would be happy to help members of other churches in the Circuit get an Alpha course off the ground by helping to train a presenter. What does a Circuit Steward do?

If you're reading this and wondering what a Circuit Steward does, the Circuit Stewards broadly enable the development of God's work in the circuit by exercising a responsibility for some of the more practical aspects of day-to-day issues: overseeing property, finance, the invitation of new ministers, and generally providing support as required. Some of the main responsibilities include:

- Meeting as a leadership team several times a year to take responsibility for the spiritual direction and wellbeing of the churches in the circuit
- Keeping ourselves informed of the activities of each local church and sharing them around the circuit
- Being aware of district and connexional policies affecting the circuit and its churches; upholding and acting upon them
- Being sensitive to the needs of the circuit, and its officers and staff
- Informing ourselves of developing movements in Methodism and the wider Church
- Being alert to, and taking advice on, the legal consequences of the office of Circuit Steward and its responsibilities, e.g. lay employment, finance, property
- Exercising pastoral care for the circuit staff (e.g. Presbyters, Lay Pastors) and their families
- Developing a vision and plan for mission

Within the circuit Within the team, we arrange how these responsibilities are exercised. There are also other specific issues related to the circuit that we share:

- Finances and the circuit fund
- Invitations and appointments
- Manses , ensuring that our properties are fit for purpose.
- Meetings (e.g. church councils, circuit meetings and district synods)

There are occasionally other issues that require our consideration and actions. These have included our Local Pastor initiative, God in love unites us (same sex marriage) and small churches following the Conference's directives, and the closure and reopening of our churches during the Covid pandemic.

Neil has been part of a working party to remove the contents of Ulleskelf chapel after its closure, and I have led a worship development group to support Rev Abi as he goes through his Probationary period of ministry. Neither of these roles are specifically the responsibility of the circuit stewards, but part of the role is the variety that it offers, and the opportunity to be more involved in the life of the Circuit, as woven threads in God's great tapestry.

As you will know, our Circuit celebrates its 200 th Anniversary this year. We look forward to supporting all the churches as they host different events to celebrate this milestone. As we plan for the life of our circuit beyond its 200 th birthday, we have started to consider the way forward. We would love to see you at the next conversation meeting on the 29 th April at Tadcaster at 7pm, or at our circuit quiet day on the 28 th March. Everyone is welcome to come and share their thoughts and visions for the future of our circuit. We would love to know, what are your threads? What part do you and can you play? And, if anyone feels called to explore the possibility of becoming a Circuit Steward, please speak to us.

Flourish Experiences

On 13-15 February we went away to our District gathering, called Flourish. The theme was 'Woven Threads' and what part we play in God's great tapestry. We had different speakers, a Bible study, prayer stations, a choice of worship styles, bands, crafts and creativity.

It was good to see people there from across the Circuit, and not all doing the same thing. We have different interests, and these different threads weave into God's plan for each of us. As we reflect on the weekend and the things we have learned, we join together the threads as part of God's tapestry in our lives and in our Circuit.

The speakers helped us to reflect on our faith and where God has and is present in our lives; the gifts that the Holy Spirit has given us; the call that Jesus has laid upon us, in all our lives. Are we attentive to God's call upon us now?

The weekend was for all ages. There was a youth programme and we were inspired by the things that the young people said on stage. They had been creative and their artwork was based on the Bible passages they had read. For example, one young boy had made a figure of Joseph and his technicolour coat and explained the story and how the colourful threads of Joseph's coat were symbolic of how Joseph led the Israelites into freedom, another part of God's tapestry of life.

In a Bible Study led by Ruth Valerio, we were led through various passages throughout the Bible, showing how each of us have a uniqueness, and we bring our own threads into God's tapestry. One of the Bible readings was from Micah 6:8. Ruth suggested that the last verse is our manifesto for life. "He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice and to love kindness and to walk humbly with your God."

These are threads for us to be woven in and our key calling as Christians. How are we seeking to live these out in our life (and this is a good reading for us at Lent)?

We were encouraged to think about our threads. Where do we fit into God's tapestry?

Where has God led you or placed you?

What else is there to come?

What does God want us to do now?

We would like to know what inspired you at Flourish? A few of you have already responded, and their comments are below.....

I attended the workshop led by 'Encounter Worship', who gave some great ideas for worship to be fully inclusive with accessibility for all, so that everyone is involved. "There is no Junior Holy Spirit" - everyone should be able to worship and encounter God, regardless of ages and disability. "An All Age service is not a children's service, it is an act of worship together. We are demonstrating what worship looks like." There were some good ideas, including using the font "Century Gothic" in PowerPoint presentations (which they had as black text on a very light green background). I tried it out at a service at Collingham and we all agreed it was a lot better! Rev Ann.
